# Call to Order

The meeting was called to order.

# Review of Year-to-Date Financial Statements

Ms. Meadows explained that SMMA did not have year-end financials because of the Annual Audit timeline. Those will be presented at the board meeting March 15, 2016. Mr. Stephens stated that Ms. Zimmerman would be explaining in detail by segment what went into the financials which were presented to the Board each month. Today Ms. Zimmerman explained the current asset portion of the financials. Ms. Zimmerman gave the Board members a handout as a visual to the presentation. Ms. Zimmerman talked about the currents assets on the balance sheet, what is included, the reason for the accounting treatment and gave them examples.

Mr. Stephens updated the Board on litigation which will be orally argued this Thursday before the Georgia Appeals Court. The argument concerns our protection against law suits based on the Recreational Property Act. The Act protects state parks open to the public for recreation from being sued in these cases. It is the States argument that we are protected under the Act.

# Review of Proposed changes to amend SMMA Ordinance on Public Speeches

Mr. Stephens reviewed SMMA's undated Ordinance on Public Speeches, Gatherings, performances, etc. The proposed Ordinance requires the groups to be issued a permit from SMMA. Up until this point SMMA has not had a permitting ordinance. There are two events coming up in April which will require permits.

SMMA researched what the National parks and the Georgia State Parks have done with Public Speech ordinances. SMMA researched what the World Congress Center and other State entities that have protests occasionally had in place. The Attorney General's office has reviewed the ordinance three times to make sure the ordinance is complying with the civil rights laws. SMMA wanted to make sure the ordinance was legal and workable. There is no fee for the permit.
